Contest Rules

- Entries must be the original work of one individual (no collaborations)
- Entries must be appropriate to the topic and not contain strong political opinions
- Submissions will be judged on message clarity and creativity by the Zeeland BPW staff
- Entries must include first and last name, grade, age, contact info for the student and/or parent
- Physical art may be dropped off at the Zeeland BPW office or a photo can be submitted at zeelandbpw.com/water-week
- Any essays submitted must be limited to 300 words or less.
- Entry into the contest allows Zeeland BPW to share the entry to our website and or social media along with the students first name.
- The contest is open to 4th-12th grade students living in Zeeland and the immediate surrounding areas (age categories for judging will be Grades 4/5, Grades 6/7/8, Grades 9/10 and Grades 11/12).
- Entries must be submitted in person or online (zeelandbpw.com/water-week) by Friday, May 2, 2025 at 11:59pm.
